TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

I am honored to begin my eighth year serving as Town Manager in Acton. I am grateful for the support and guidance from the Select Board members. Under their leadership we have made significant progress in advancing community priorities and enhancing the effectiveness and efficiency of our local government. We are fortunate to have talented and dedicated staff who commit their professional lives to public service across all departments. Their expertise and daily efforts ensure the delivery of high-quality services to our residents. Thank you as well to the many residents who contribute their time on boards and committees, attend Town Meetings, and stay actively engaged in the community.

The Select Board recently completed its annual goal setting process. The Board held listening sessions and solicited comments and feedback from the community then held a workshop on June 9th to establish short-term and long-term goals. On June 16th the following goals were adopted.

SHORT-TERM GOALS

- Finalize Design and Secure Funding to Complete Town Hall HVAC and Emergency Power Replacement Project and Related Building Accessibility Improvements
- Advance Town Meeting participation/access/education improvements, including early communication of warrant items to the public.
- Create a communications position to improve community engagement.
- Bring DPW facility project to Town Meeting. Work with Finance Committee, and other Town Committees to move project forward.
- Complete study and begin implementation of Fire/EMS deployment and staffing study, including a capital plan for Fire Stations upgrades or replacement.

LONG-TERM GOALS

- Explore additional tax relief programs for low income taxpayers
- Start a yearly Porchfest Concert Series for West Acton.
- Continue Main Street intersection and complete streets improvements, i.e. Hayward, plus Central, High, Maple, Nylander, Railroad, School
- Work with Volunteer Coordinating Committee to create a plan for the future of volunteer recruitment and onboarding that includes improved orientation and streamlined reappointment process.
- Advance efforts to establish a public art plan and initiatives that utilize the arts to improve outcomes for economic development and public health.
- Approve the final Stormwater Infrastructure Plan and begin implementation.
- Facilitate low-income Community Solar and research the potential of including this option as part of a lower tier in the Acton Power Choice program.
- Research and develop a proactive strategy for gas line replacement, repair, and non-pipeline alternatives.

More Road Work!

We have a lot of road work going on right now. We appreciate your patience. In addition to the Kelley's Corner project (more at right) which is starting to really take shape, we have begun other road projects. Shown below is the first day of the reconstruction of the Prospect Street intersection. This project will improve safety by creating better defined entrances and exits, traffic calming measures and pedestrian improvements. It is anticipated that construction will last about 6-8 weeks and be completed in the early fall.



Kelley's Corner Update



Also, we recently started the Powder Mill Road sewer extension project and eventual complete street improvements. During construction hours, the contractor intends to use lane closures on the affected roadways, leaving the westbound lane on Powder Mill Road and the southbound lane on High Street open during these hours, when work occurs in these areas. The closed lanes will be reopened after work is complete for the day, and on days when work will not occur. There also may be an occasional need to temporarily close both travel lanes. In this event, a detour route will be set up during these temporary closures, with traffic detail police officers assisting motorists and directing the flow of traffic. The route will also be posted to this page. The expected duration of the project is from early June 2025 to late November 2025. Please refer to the phased work plan below for the project schedule details.

These improvements to the roadways are necessary to improve safety for the community. Some have asked why we are starting these projects now before Kelley's Corner is completed. Kelley's Corner will be completed this winter and we expect significant and noticeable progress to occur this summer. The summer is the best time because the weather is good and it avoids school-related traffic on the roadways. In the next year or so we also expect to start making improvements to intersections on Great Road. Stay tuned for more updates and thank you again for your patience.

I am pleased to announce the Town of Acton's annual Independence Day celebration will be hosted at NARA Park on July 4th beginning at 5pm. This year's musical guest is Thirty 6 Red who will take the stage around 7pm. There will be a wide variety of food truck options on site beginning at 5pm and the night will be capped by a lively fireworks display that is set to begin about 9:30pm. Shuttle buses will be available from satellite parking areas along Nagog Park Drive to NARA beginning at 5pm with a pause from 7:30pm until the end of fireworks. We anticipate long travel days during and after the event around the area and ask that you plan on longer times than normal leaving parking areas and NARA park. TOWN MANAGER'S UPDATE

New Hours at Town Hall

In the last five years we have experienced significant changes to how the public accesses the services that we provide. Remote and virtual services were introduced during the pandemic and have remained a primary option for many. We have technology solutions that allow for meetings, permitting, payments, licensing, and other services to be conducted online any time of day. The extension of the work day through virtual availability has helped improve services. However, this new way of doing business has created noticeable impacts on employees and has become a recruitment and retention issue. We have observed through exit interviews and engagement with staff in various departments that we are not competitive with comparable communities. Staff turnover is costly for morale and organizational capacity. As part of several measures to improve recruitment and retention, we are changing the service hours in Town Hall so that we are now closing at 4pm on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, closing at 6pm on Tuesdays, and Fridays will remain the same.

Small Business Association Meeting Hosted in Acton

I was pleased to attend the Small Business Association meeting and network event at Town Hall on June 11th. A panel consisting of Lisa Gonzalez Welch from the Small Business Administration; Nancy Gerardi from the Massachusetts Small Business Development Center NE Region; Sharavanthi Reddy from Northeast SCORE; Emily Maquire from Massachusetts Supplier Diversity Office; Kristen Guichard, Planning Director; Patricia Costa, Director of Economic Development; and co-Chair of the Economic Development Committee, Patricia Sutherland. The event was well attended with a few dozen small business owners from Acton. We fielded questions and discussed support available to small businesses throughout the Commonwealth.
