

NET METERING CREDITS ALLOCATION



WHAT IS NET METERING?

1. Put simply, when your renewable energy source produces more power than you need this excess is sent to your utility provider.
2. The utility provider then sends you a credit you can use to offset costs when you might not generate enough power.

What can I do with my net metering credits (NMCs)?

You can use your credits to offset your future bills from Eversource OR you can give your credits to a different account. The account of your choice must be signed up with Eversource and located within the same ISO-NE load zone. In eastern Massachusetts, other customers must be in your same load zone of either southeastern (SEMA) or northeastern Massachusetts (NEMA) to receive credits (see the map [here](#)).

Facts about NMCs allocation

- You need to submit a Schedule Z form that declares what will happen with your NMCs
- You can only submit a Schedule Z form twice in a calendar year, which means you can only choose who receives your NMCs twice in a calendar year
- You can allocate your NMCs to a public entity
